

## Ballyholme Yacht Club - Fire Evacuation Procedure

It is a legal requirement that all employees are familiar with the means of escape provided and the routine to be followed in the event of a fire.

All staff should act to a pre-determined plan, using all available exits, to ensure safe, orderly and efficient evacuation of the Club, and to keep fire damage to a minimum.

## What to do on discovery of a fire:

- Raise the alarm by operating the nearest fire alarm break-glass call point. This will initiate the fire alarm, which is a continuous ringing bell.
- Call the Fire Service immediately and without delay on 999 giving the following information
  - a. Full address of BYC
  - b. Location and extent of fire within the premises, if known
  - c. Building is being/has been evacuated
  - d. Number, if known, of persons unaccounted for
- Begin immediate evacuation of the premises and provide assistance to people with disabilities, visitors, young people etc.
- If practicable, close all doors before leaving the premises
- Proceed to the Assembly Point.
- Try to establish if anyone is missing to notify the Fire Service on their arrival.
- Advise the Club or Office Manager or one of the Executive Committee of the incident
- Do no re-enter the building until informed it is safe to do so.

## Location of the Assembly Point

The main assembly point is in the North Dinghy Park.

If, for any reason, this is unsuitable, use the South Dinghy Park as an alternative

## Fight the fire ONLY if:

- The Fire Service has been notified
- The fire is small and is not spreading to other areas
- Escaping the area is possible by backing up to the nearest exit
- You have been trained to use the extinguisher
