# NOTICE OF RACE

#### **ORGANISING AUTHORITY**

This event will be organised by Ballyholme Yacht Club.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the notice of race (NoR) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Racing rules Race Signals AP, 33, 35, 60.1(a), 60.1(b), 61.3, 62.1(a), 62.2, A2 A5.1 and A5.2 will be changed. The changes appear, in full, either in this notice of race or in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.

# **2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

The sailing instructions will be available on www.ballyholme.com.

# **3 COMMUNICATION**

- 3.1 The official noticeboard is located on the window of the cadet room at Ballyholme Yacht Club visible from the outside.
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

# 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to boats of the RS Aero class.
- 4.2 All competitors shall be a member of the Irish or other RS Aero Class Association.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online form at <a href="www.ballyholme.com">www.ballyholme.com</a> and paying online.
- 4.4 If racing is to be held as a single fleet, finishing positions will be calculated using Portsmouth Handicap.
- 4.5 To be considered an entry at an event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.6 Any competitors aged under 18 shall complete an Under 18s Consent Form. This can be downloaded from the RS Class Association website and should be completed and handed in at registration.
- 4.7 [NP] [DP] The Organising Authority may cancel the event, cancel classes and reject or cancel entries in its absolute discretion, subject to RRS 76.
- 4.8 [NP] [DP] Should the Organising Authority cancel a class or reject an entry they shall refund

the entry fee in full.

# 9 SCHEDULE

- 9.1 Registration Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May 1900 to 2030. Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> May 0900 to 1015.
- 9.2 Briefing A Briefing will be held at 1015 on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> May.
- 9.3 Racing:

- 9.4 Six Races are scheduled.
- 9.5 The scheduled time of the first warning signal of the first race on Saturday is 1155. The scheduled time of the first warning signal of the first race on Sunday is 1055.
- 9.6 On the last day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500.

# 10 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

Boats may be inspected at any time.

# 11 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

RRS 40.1 shall apply at all times while afloat.

#### 12 VENUE

The Sailing Area will be to the north of Ballyholme Bay in Belfast Lough.

#### 13 COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be Windward Leeward or Trapezoid.

# 14 PENALTY SYSTEM

Appendix T and the Post Race Penalty apply to this regatta. Decisions from Arbitration can be referred to the protest committee but cannot be reopened or appealed.

#### 15 SCORING

- 15.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 15.2 When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.
- 15.3 All boats will be scored using corrected times calculated using the Portsmouth Yardstick system.

# 16 [DP] [NP] SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 16.1 Support teams, including all support persons and support person vessels shall stay 150m outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first start until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 16.2 When the engine of a support vessel is running, all support persons on that vessel, shall wear a personal flotation device and the support vessel driver shall use a kill cord.

# 17 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

Does not apply.

#### 18 BERTHING

[DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the dinghy park.

# 19 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Does not apply.

# 20 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

#### 21 DATA PROTECTION

The Data Processing Policy is available on the class website.

#### 22 RISK STATEMENT

22.1 RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone".

Sailing by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

# 22.2 [NP] [DP] COVID Statement

By taking part in any of the events covered by this notice of race, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that they are responsible for complying with any regulations in force from time to time in respect of COVID-19 and for complying with the venue/OA/sailing club COVID-19 procedures. Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official. Failure to comply may be misconduct. Reasonable actions by event officials to implement COVID-19 guidance, protocols, or legislation, even if they later prove to be unnecessary, are not improper actions or omissions.

# 23 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 Pounds Sterling per incident or the equivalent.

# 24 PRIZES

Prizes may be awarded, dependant on entries and at the discretion of the Race Committee, in each class as follows:

First, Second and Third First Junior First Female Helm First Master (over 55)
