Sailing Instructions

for the

LUFRA CUP MENAGERIE RACE

SATURDAY 6th September 2025

The Lufra Cup Menagerie Race is a pursuit handicap race. Entry forms are posted on the Royal Ulster Yacht Club notice board, Ballyholme Yacht Club notice board and Bangor Marina notice board. Entry closes on Friday 5th September at 12:00 hrs.

The notation [NP] in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the RYA will apply
- 1.3 Racing rules 25, 26, 29.1, A4, A5, 35, 40, 60.1, 63.1 will be changed. The changes appear in full in these sailing instructions.

2. ENTRY FEE

2.1 There will be an entry fee of £5.00 per person (at least!) and all proceeds go to the RNLI. This will be collected in the BYC Lounge area after the race.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 12:00 hrs on the day of the race on the notice board at Royal Ulster Yacht Club, Bangor Marina and on the front door of Ballyholme Yacht Club.

4. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

4.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on a notice board at Royal Ulster Yacht Club, Bangor Marina and at the front door of Ballyholme Yacht Club.



5. CODE OF CONDUCT

5.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

6. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 6.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the main flagpole at Ballyholme Yacht Club and the flagpole in Bangor Marina.
- 6.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in the race signal AP.

7. SCHEDULE OF RACE

- 7.1 The scheduled time of the Warning Signal for the first class to start is 13:24 hrs.
- 7.2 Starting times, class flags (and any related instructions) will be posted on the notice board at Royal Ulster Yacht Club, Bangor Marina and the front door at Ballyholme Yacht Club no later than 18:00 hrs on Friday 5th September. A copy will also be posted on the Ballyholme Yacht Club website at www.ballyholme.com

8. THE COURSE

- 8.1 The course will be a windward/leeward course. The diagram in Attachment 1 shows the courses, including the order in which the marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 The course (A or B) will be identified on a blackboard at the stern of the Committee boat, a blue coloured motorboat 'Juniper'
- 8.3 The Topper Class will complete one lap of the course only and will then finish at the Committee boat, as shown by the red arrow in Attachment 1. All other boats should continue sailing around Marks 1, 2, & 3 until their finish.
- 8.4 A lead boat flying Flag 'B' may be provided to indicate the position of the next mark to the leading boats initially. The lead boat will be withdrawn after the first boats complete their first lap.

9. MARKS

9.1 Marks 1, 2 and 3 will be yellow inflatables.

10. OBSTRUCTIONS

10.1 Official boats, including a safety boat in close attendance to a craft or competitor in difficulty, are designated as an obstruction



11. THE START

- 11.1 The starting line will be between an orange mast on the committee boat displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and the green port-end starting mark.
- 11.2 RRS 26 will not apply. The Warning and Preparatory Signals for the first Start will be made at three-minute intervals, followed by Starting Signals for other Classes as indicated in the schedule of SI 6.2 above. After the first Preparatory Signal, Flag "P" will be displayed continuously; the Preparatory Signal for the immediately preceding Class will be the Warning Signal for the next Class, and the displaying of the Class Flag shall be the Preparatory Signal for that Class. In the context of this Sailing Instruction (SI), the expression "Class" means all and any individual boats and Classes given a particular start time in the schedule of SI 6.2.
- 11.3 In amendment of RRS 29.1, Flag "X" only will be displayed as appropriate for a maximum of 30 seconds, otherwise, it is the responsibility of each boat to ensure that she has complied with the starting procedure.

12. THE FINISH

- 8.1 The Finishing Line for all boats, except the Toppers, will be set at approximately 15:15 hrs and will be between a Committee Boat (RIB) flying a blue flag and a yellow mark with black stripe, set along the leg of the course being sailed by the lead boat(s).
- 8.2 The Toppers will finish between the blue flag on the Committee boat, and a red inflatable mark a short distance to her starboard side.
- 8.3 The Finishing Signal will be Flag "S" and will be displayed from the Committee Boat. In amendment of RRS 25 and Race Signals, no sound signal will be made when the signal is displayed.

13. TIME LIMITS

13.1 Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35 and A4.

14. SAFETY

- 14.1[DP] A boat that retires from the race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible
- 14.2 Boats shall display a clearly visable sail number on their main sail compliant with their class rules. No two boats of the same fleet shall display numerically identical sail numbers.
- 14.31 Dinghies and Multihulls shall carry an adequate towing warp, at least 7 metres in length, always secured to a strong point.
- 14.4 In amendment of RRS 40, each person sailing in Dinghy or Multihull Classes shall always wear adequate personal buoyancy when afloat.



14.5 YTC Keelboats shall comply with ORC Special Regulations Category 4 and anchors are not allowed to be stowed projecting forward of the bow. All other keelboats shall carry a bilge pump, a bucket, an anchor and line, a compass, a life jacket complete with whistle for each crewmember

15. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1 Protest time is 90 minutes after the finish time of the last boat to finish.
- 15.2 Protest forms are available at Ballyholme Yacht Club. Hearing Requests and Requests for Redress shall be delivered there within Protest Time. The time will be posted on the front door of Ballyholme Yacht Club.
- 15.3 Notices will be posted no later than 2 days after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest committee room, located at Ballyholme Yacht Club.
- 15.4 Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 15.5 Breaches of Sailing Instruction 13 will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes Rule 60.1. Penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification if the protest committee so decides.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATION

16.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

17. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

17.1 [NP] A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rule and sailing instructions.

18. SUPPLIED BOATS

Does not apply

19. OFFICIAL VESSELS

19.1 Committee boat and all safety craft



20. SUPPORT PERSONS VESSELS

Does not apply

21. TRASH DISPOSAL

21.1 Trash may be placed aboard official vessels

22. BERTHING

Does not apply

23. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Does not apply

24. PRIZES

- 24.1 Prizes will be given as follows and the Prizes will be awarded at the BYC Annual Prize Giving:
 - The Lufra Cup is given to the Overall Winner (first finisher)
 - First BYC Cruiser (Bob Waterson Cup)
 - First Dinghy
 - First Topper

25. RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- 25.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- 25.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- 25.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.



- 25.4 Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- 25.5 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- 25.6The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 25.7It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

26 INSURANCE


26.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000.00 per incident or the equivalent.

27 ENTRY FEE

27.1 There will be an entry fee of £5.00 per person (at least!) and all proceeds go to the RNLI. This will be collected in the BYC Lounge area after the race.



Attachment 1



The Topper Class will complete one lap only and will finish between the Committee Boat and a small red mark, either in front or astern of the Committee Boat, as shown with the red arrow in Course A and Course B above.

All other boats will continue to sail around the three large Yellow marks, as described in SI8.
