SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 RULES**
See NoR 1
- 2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**
Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS**
Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the south-facing window of the Cadet Room of Ballyholme Yacht Club.
- 4 CODE OF CONDUCT**
[DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.
- 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**
Signals made ashore will be displayed at the main flagpole.
- 6 SCHEDULE OF RACES**
See NoR 9.
- 7 CLASS FLAGS**

Class	Flag	First Start Time (Saturday)
Windsurfer/Windfoiler	No1 pennant	1100
Wing	No2 pennant	1105

Starts may be combined if insufficient entries to warrant separate starts (under No1 pennant).
- 8 RACING AREA**
Will be in Ballyholme Bay.
- 9 COURSES**
Each class will sail the course as indicated in the diagram attached in Appendix A.
- 10 MARKS**
For the slalom racing, Start mark is a round green inflatable; Marks 1, 2 and 3 are yellow inflatable; the finish mark is a round red inflatable.
- 11 OBSTRUCTIONS**
A rescue boat in close attendance to a casualty is an obstruction.

12 THE START

12.1 The starting line will be between the Committee Boat and a green inflatable mark.

12.2 RRS 26 shall apply. Start times and signals will be as follows:

Starting sequence:

Start - 3 minutes	Warning Signal	Display Class Flag
Start – 2 minutes	Preparatory Signal	Display Flag P
Start – 1 minute		Remove Flag P
Start		Remove Class Flag

12.3 A competitor that does not start within 1 minute after their starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

12.4 A board sailor whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.

13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

Does not apply.

14 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a Committee Boat and an inflatable red mark.

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

See NoR 10.

16 TIME LIMITS

16.1 A sailor not finishing within 5 minutes of the lead board in their class will be scored DNF.

16.2 In addition to RRS 32, the race committee may also award a score to a board sailor that is still racing by displaying to her from a committee vessel (which may be in motion) flag W with one sound signal. A board sailor so notified is no longer required to sail the course, shall stop racing and shall return to the starting area, or return ashore if there is no more racing. A finishing score under this sailing instruction will be the score she would have received had she sailed the course and finished within any time limit, without gaining or losing any place. However, when two or more board sailors that are overlapped are notified, they will be scored as if they were tied. The decision by the race committee to use this procedure or not to use it shall not be grounds for requesting redress. This changes rules 60.1(b) and 62.1(a).

17 HEARING REQUESTS

17.1 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last board sailor has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is the later. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.

17.2 Hearing request forms shall include the email address and contact telephone number of the protestor and, when possible, the protestee.

17.3 Hearing Request forms are available at the Club Office or Members Lounge at Ballyholme Yacht Club.

17.4 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

19 SAFETY REGULATIONS

[DP] [NP] A board sailor who retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. This can be done by contacting the IWA/BYC Beach Master or any on-water event Safety vessel.

20 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

[DP] [NP] Substitution of competitors is not allowed without prior approval of the race committee.

21 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

[NP] A board or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.

22 OFFICIAL VESSELS

Details of the start Committee Boat and the finish boat will be disclosed at the competitors' briefing. Ballyholme Yacht Club patrol vessels are RIBs, typically orange in colour.

Slalom Course (may be to port or starboard)

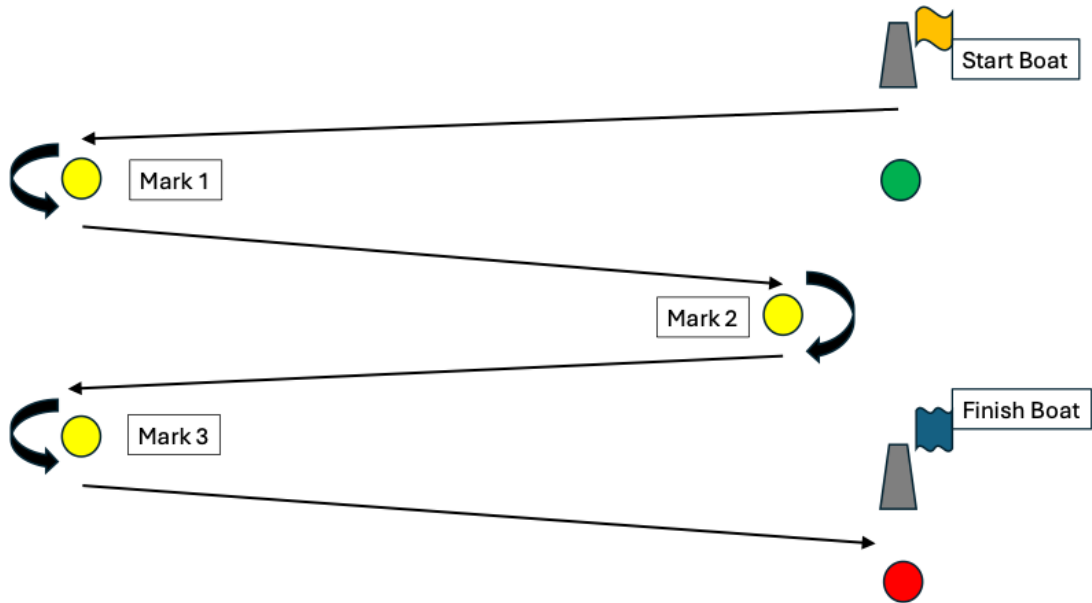
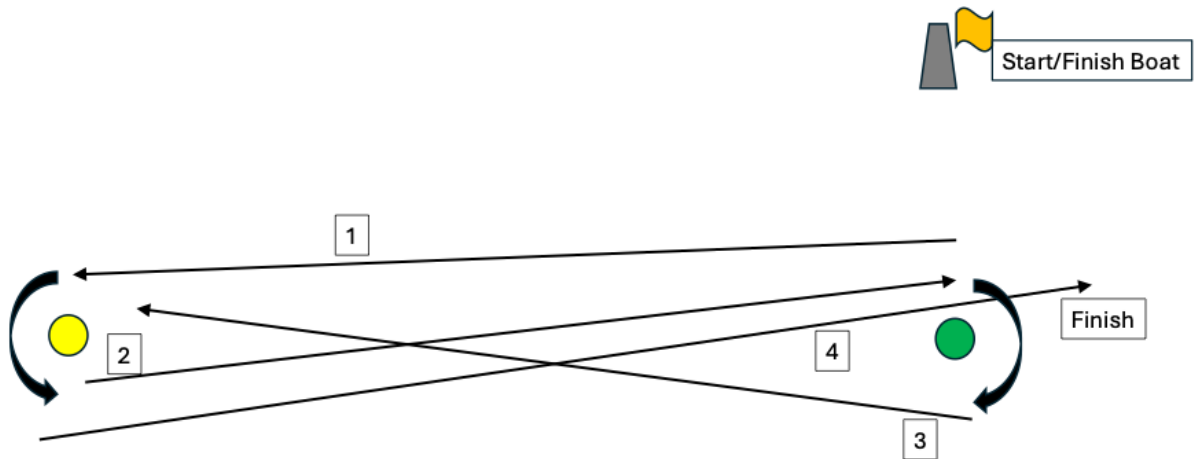


Figure of Eight Course (may be to port or starboard)
